Heritage	San Gregorio Magno Parish Church	Built in February 2, 1829, this baroque structure stands lofty right in the heart of the town.	Cebu City Pier/ Mactan Cebu International Airport/Cebu South Bus Terminal (travel time: 4 hours from Cebu City)
	Bantayan sa Hari (watchtower)	Serves as a fortress during the Spanish era while the locals observed for incoming Moro marauders for possible attack	-do-
	Puerta dela Marina	The "Gateway to the Sea", it connects the two watch towers while its wall complex is the west entrance of the pueblo.	-do-

	<p>Holy Trinity College</p>	<p>The structure is made coral stone and served as wall where the public market is located.</p> <p>One of the pioneering school institution in the south, catering to secondary and college education. The school was founded by the late Rev. Fr. Leonardo Duterte Arriba. The school became a military hospital during the Japanese occupation during the world war. It was established in 1888; made of coral stone and limestone like any colonial structure during the Spanish era and has a total area of 760.32 square meters and its run by Daughters of St.. Theresa (DST) today.</p>	<p>-do-</p>
	<p>Old Ginatilan Municipal Hall</p>	<p>It was constructed under the then Alkalde Mayor Demetrio V. Jabagat in 1917, still stands today and houses the Municipal Treasury Office, BIR, PNP, Ginatilan Fire Station, DILG, Post Office as well as the COMELEC</p>	<p>-do-</p>
	<p>Ancestral House of the Ferrarens</p>	<p>Known as the Casa Real of the Seat of the Government during the Spanish period</p>	

	<p>Ancestral House of the Ferolins</p>	<p>It is The house of Capitan Mayor German Ferraren. It was believed that simple transactions and functions were performed here and like any other colonial heritage, it is made of stone and hardwood. Uninhabited though some heirs will d come during the Holy Week</p> <p>Another century- old structure, the house of Fortunata Ferolin Jomuad, the first woman Municipal Vice-Mayor. Built in 1700 by the son of the 1st Capitan del Barrio, Justiano Ferrolin. The lower part of the house was used as classrooms during the Spanish era.</p>	
	<p>Divine Mercy Shrine</p>	<p>Located at Mount Hambubuyog, Barangay Mangaco, it is the highest peak of the municipality. A week after holy week is the feast of the Divine Mercy and devotees from all walks of life from the neighboring towns of Malabuyoc, Oslob, Santander, and Samboan trooped to the place.</p>	

		<p>Despite the distance from the town proper, still the faithful come to pay homage and visit the place.</p>	
	<p>Ginatilan Millennium Park</p>	<p>A park by the sea, Ginatilanons young and old alike can feel the fresh sea breeze while taking a break especially during afternoons.</p>	
	<p>Municipal Stage and Auditorium</p>	<p>This Sydney-type-Opera inspired municipal stage stands with pride showcasing the ingenuity of the Ginatilanons.</p>	
	<p>Ginatilan Marine Sanctuary</p>	<p>Stretching from Barangay Poblacion to Guiwanon, a 12.5 hectare marine sanctuary is a home to many species alongside with beautiful corals underwater.</p>	
	<p>Ginatilan Marine Sea Grass</p>	<p>It is located in Barangay San Roque which can be seen at the park is a home to many marine species like sea turtles.</p>	
	<p>Ginatilan Lighthouse</p>	<p>Locally known as “parola”, it is located at the Millennium Park, which serves as a guiding light to everyone, especially the seafarers and fishermen alike.</p>	

	<p>Our Lady of Assumption Statue</p>	<p>Just adjacent to the San Gregorio Magno Parish church, the statue is a towering gesture.</p>	
	<p>San Pedro Calungsod Monument</p>	<p>The monument, located at the left side of the church, just adjacent of the Municipal Auditorium, along the major street of the town, has served as “a solemn prayer place” for Ginatilanons, pilgrims, faithful and devotees alike. Built in 1995, the San Pedro Calungsod monument was initiated by Reverend Father Marion Mejia, then Parish Priest assigned in San Gregorio Magno Parish Church, Ginatilan, Cebu.</p>	
	<p>Mount Hambubuyog</p>	<p>The highest peak in The municipality, perfect site for meditation and reflection where can see the beautiful neighboring islands of Negros, Bohol and Siquijor. It’s also a ideal place for camping.</p>	
	<p>Dr. Leandro Tojong Residence Ruins</p>	<p>One can see the only remaining ruins of the once happy abode of Dr. Leandro Tojong, its stairs facing the highway.</p>	

	<p>Old Water Tank</p> <p>Birhen sa Paradahan</p>	<p>Dr. Tojong became City Mayor of Cebu City and Congressman of the then 5th District of Cebu.</p> <p>Used to cater water supply in the municipality way back then; now only the tank remains in Barnagay San Roque.</p> <p>It is situated in the interior part of Barangay Poblacion and devotees come to pay homage to Mama Mary.</p>	
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
